



## **ENVIRONMENTAL AND WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY**

FRGW accept that our processes may have an effect on the environment and have set out objectives to monitor and minimise the impact. Through a reasonable and proactive attitude to environmental issues, FRGW are committed to minimising potentially harmful effects on the environment and to contributing to sustainable measures, balancing our business aims with the environmental considerations.

Where it is within our influence or control in both design and construction, we aim to:

1. To comply with current legislation associated with environmental issues i.e. The Control of Pollution (amended) Act 1989 and Environmental Protection Act 1990.
2. Propose ways that may reduce the environmental impact of a project.
3. Carry out 'on site' environmental risk assessments to help reduce noise, dust, and waste where possible. Consult with residence that may impacted upon activities being carried out.
4. Ensure that all FRGW staff and sub-contractors are trained in all aspects of the use of hazardous substances, including appropriate methods of storage and disposal.
5. Whenever possible, employ a system of recycling for items such as paper, wood, metal, glass, and bricks both on site and in the office.
6. Working with sub-contractors and suppliers to improve our environmental performance.
7. Seek to source all materials from renewable sources where practical.
8. Retain our waste carriers license under Regulation 28 of the Waste (England and Wales) Regulations 2011; Registered Carrier Registration CBDU299333 and comply with the waste duty of care code of practice 2016.
